Getting to Know One Another:

- **2.** When was the last time you had the opportunity to give someone grace. What were the results?

Into the Bible:

Read Ephesians 2:1-10

- **1.** What stands out to you about this passage? Are there any repetitions or key themes that you can discern?
- 2. When Paul says "you" (2:2) and "all of us" (2:3) who is he referring to?
- **3.** Who does Paul argue is "dead in their transgressions," the Jewish Christians in Ephesus or the Greek Christians?
- **4.** How important is grace to the Christian message, and how would you define it?
- **5.** Paul is trying to bring two groups of Christians (Jews and Greeks) together as one church. Yet they have different backgrounds, experiences, politics, customs and values. If we had the best secular minds in a room, what do you imagine they might say is the best way to accomplish this?
- 6. How would you describe Paul's approach and how, if at all, is it different?
- 7. Paul refers to the ruler of the kingdom of the air, and elsewhere says he believes we are in a spiritual battle with unseen forces. Do you have the sense that the battle between good and evil extends beyond this physical world, or is all as it appears to be?
- 8. What do you believe our best weapons are against evil?
- **9.** Read the passage again out loud. What else to you stands out to you about this passage? What is the Spirit revealing to you in this moment?
- **10.**On the following page is a picture of Paul's Chiastic structure which he uses in Ephesians 2:1-10. Chiastic structures build up to a central point like climbing a mountain, and then climb back down using parallel word or phrases to
